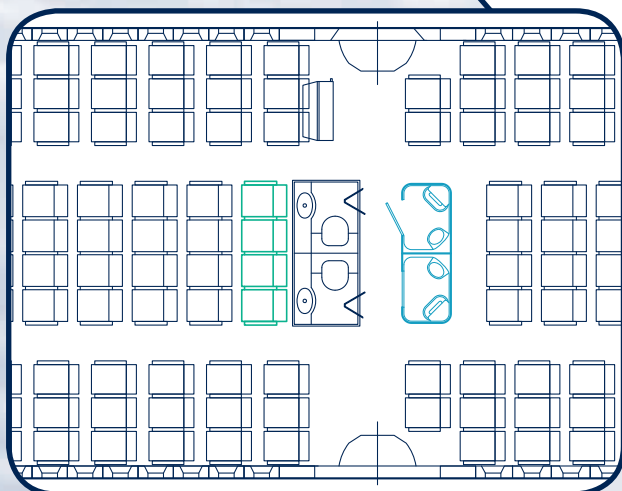


Washrooms with Urinal Cabins

According to a DASELL market study, up to 70 percent of passengers on long-range flights are male. The new sanitary compartment with smaller floor space takes this into account by employing urinals, providing space for up to four extra seats on a B747-400, for example. The reduction in overall weight is a fuel cost savings for the airlines with correspondingly lower CO2 emissions.



- **Hygiene:** The lavatories remain cleaner due to utilization in a predominantly seated position.
- **Length of use:** The length of use of urinals is shorter compared with standard lavatories.
- **Fittings:** Simpler facilities for urinals, resulting in lower outfitting and service costs.
- **Added seating space:** Greater passenger capacity without any loss of comfort, greater cost-covering effects for airline.

Washroom-only

Also, one possible component of the solution is washroom-only, used as a dressing room, for instance. The passenger enters a small, pleasingly lit, "furnished" room with harmoniously matching colours and materials.

Greater convenience: Reduced utilization frequency for standard lavatories, improved hygiene, more time for use as a washroom.

Advantages for women: increase in number of lavatories for seated use per passenger, shorter waiting times.
